We will read scripture from Romans 12 v.10 and St. Paul's letters to learn about using our words and actions to build others up and not pull them down or apart.

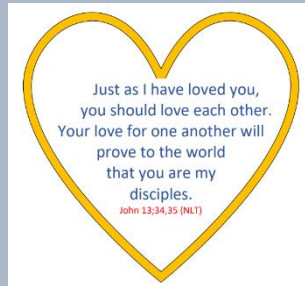
We will be able to articulate what 'Mutual Respect' means.
